Historical

This fine old limestone home was built around 1860 for Thomas Waring.

His father, Joshua Waring, purchased the 200 acre farm, on which the house stands, in approximately 1820 after he emigrated from Ireland.

The Waring farming and mercantile family lived here for about one hundred years, through rebellion and confederation, two world wars, the great depression and incredible changes in farming and industry, before parting with it in 1968.



With its multi-paned windows and Georgian style joinery work, what is currently called the Barley Room Pub may have been the original 1820's Waring Homestead and was added on to by the second generation.

Originally, the house had French windows at the front and at one time had a wrap-around veranda, although these features have long since disappeared. To the rear of the building was the original drive-through carriage house – now the lower part of the Barley Room Pub.
